Army JROTC Curriculum

The curriculum consists of course subjects such as Citizenship in Action, Leadership Theory & Application, Foundations for Success, Citizenship in American History & Government, Geography/Map Reading Skills, Career Opportunities, Roles of the Armed Forces and Responsibility. There is also a MANDATORY physical training portion of instructions which compliments the academic instructions.

Blended Instruction and Remote Learning Platform:

Blended instruction (live and non-live) will take on multiple forms: pre-recorded instruction with live Google forms, flipped classrooms with added discussion forums, scheduled Google Meets, etc. Students will follow the direction of the teacher to determine how “class time” will be managed for each allotted class period.
